WOMEN IN MILITARY SERVICE FOR AMERICA MEMORIAL

The Women's Memorial is located at the entrance to Arlington National Cemetery, across Memorial Bridge from the Lincoln Memorial. Dedicated in 1997, this 33,000 square foot facility honors all military women - past, present and future - and memorializes the collective and individual histories of servicewomen from the American Revolution to the present. A computerized interactive *Register* displays photographs and individual histories of servicewomen and exhibits depict women's contributions to our national defense through uniforms, artifacts, photographs, film and much, much more.

Parking and Transportation. There is no parking at the Women's Memorial; however, *public parking is available at the Arlington National Cemetery Visitors Center* for a modest fee. Enter left from Memorial Drive. Metro accessible on the Blue Line to Arlington National Cemetery. Both parking and Metro access are about a one-city block walk to the Women's Memorial.

Driving Directions. Travel maps are available on the World Wide Web by entering Yahoo and selecting "Maps" and then "Driving Directions." Enter your origin point and for destination enter Zip Code 22211 (Arlington National Cemetery).

From Norfolk and Richmond: Take 1-95 north. Near the Washington Beltway (495), take Route 395 north toward Washington. Exit at 8-B (Arlington National Cemetery) to Route 27. Stay in the left lane to the circle and proceed counter-clockwise around the circle to Memorial Drive.

From northern Maryland and Pennsylvania: Take Route 70 east to Frederick, then Route 1-270 south to Route 495 toward northern Virginia. Exit off 495 to the George Washington Parkway east (toward Washington). Off the parkway, take the exit for Memorial Bridge / Arlington National Cemetery. Immediately after the underpass, take the Arlington National Cemetery exit to a stop sign and turn left onto Memorial Drive.

From northern Virginia: Take Route 50 east to the George Washington Parkway south/ National Airport. Stay in right lane; follow signs to Arlington National Cemetery/Memorial Drive. Do not cross the Potomac River.

From I-66: Take Exit 73 (Roslyn) to the second traffic light, turn right onto Fort Myer Drive. After the underpass, follow the signs to Route 50 east. Turn left onto Route 50 east, stay in the right lane, and follow signs to Arlington National Cemetery.

From southern Maryland: Take Route 295 north toward Washington. Watch for the Arlington National Cemetery/Memorial Bridge sign, the cemetery will be on your left and the Pentagon will be on your right. Proceed to the circle, stay in the left lane going counter clockwise around to Memorial Drive. Do not cross the Potomac River.

From Washington, DC: Take Constitution Avenue east; turn left at 23rd Street toward the Lincoln Memorial. Stay right onto Memorial Bridge. Get in the far left lane on the bridge, go part way around the circle and turn right onto Memorial Drive.

NOTE: If any guests are unable to walk to the Women's Memorial, call 703 892 2606 the week before the event. The staff will request a permit to allow a driver to go to the Memorial and drop off guests before returning to Arlington National Cemetery Visitors Center parking. The Memorial is handicapped accessible.
